



IMPORTANT FACTS ABOUT THE 2020 PRIMARY ELECTION

CALVERT COUNTY, MARYLAND

- **Voting will be primarily by mail**
 - Calvert County Board of Elections (“BOE”) will mail ballots in early May to all eligible, active voters.
 - Return envelope will be postage prepaid.
 - If a voter does not receive a ballot by May 12, contact the BOE at **410-535-2214** or by email at elections@calvertcountymd.gov
 - All ballots must be postmarked on or before **Primary Election Day, June 2**.
 - Ballots may be dropped off in the designated box in the parking lot of the BOE (30 Duke Street, Prince Frederick) from May 21 to June 2 at 8 pm.
 - The oath on the ballot **MUST** be signed by the voter.
 - Voters do NOT have to request an absentee ballot unless they wish to have their ballot(s) sent to a different address or prefer web delivery.
 - Absentee ballots must be postmarked on or before June 2.
 - All mail-in ballots must be received no later than 10 am on June 12.
- **In-Person Voting**
 - **To reduce the spread of the novel coronavirus, the BOE recommends that voters who can vote by mail do so. In-person voting will be extremely limited.**
 - CDC guidelines will be in effect with respect to physical distancing. Please be prepared to wear a mask.
 - In-person voting will be held **ONLY** at the BOE (30 Duke Street, Prince Frederick) from **7 am to 8 pm on Tuesday, June 2** for those who need assistance, wish to register to vote, have not received a ballot or simply prefer to vote in person.
 - There will be **NO** early in-person voting for the 2020 Primary Election.
- **Important Dates**
 - Deadline to register to vote – May 27
 - Deadline for changing party affiliation – May 27
 - Deadline for address change – May 27
 - Mail-in changes must be postmarked on or before May 27. Online changes must be done by 9 pm on May 27 (visit <https://voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/VoterSearch>)
